Did you know?

Exposing young children to a wide variety of fonts is an excellent way to enable children to truly master letter names.

Materials

WHAT TO DO

- As you and your child walk through various aisles of a store, ask her to look for a particular letter on labels (boxes, signs, etc.). For example, "In this aisle, look for items that start with the letter /t/?"
- You can adapt this by playing at home (invite your child to search for items in your pantry, refrigerator, etc.).
- 3. If your child needs support, show her the letter and ask her to find something with that starts with the same letter. For example, you may show them a can of tomatoes and point to the letter T (and then ask her to find a different item that either starts with or has a letter /t/).
